



GCRD Mission





TEXRail Extension to Ft Worth Medical District



- TEXRail operations to DFW Airport started January 2019
- NCTCOG, TEXRail, TxDOT, UP collaboration
- Several components of the project were negotiated in 2009-2012 time frame when Chisholm Trail Pkwy was contemplated
- ~ 30% design in 2023


